

Lesson 4 Salvation

Deliverance from the power and effects of sin, the works of darkness and the coming wrath of God.

Romans 5:8-9 | Saved from the Wrath of God

⁸ But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. ⁹ Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from wrath through Him.

Romans 1:18 | The wrath of God is a divine expression of God's holiness and justice.

¹⁸ For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who suppress the truth in unrighteousness.

- If God would not punish sin, He would not be just.
- If God were not just, He would not be God.
- God's justice was satisfied when His wrath was poured on Jesus.

The Power of the Cross:

Colossians 2:13-15

¹³And you, who were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made alive together with him, having forgiven us all our trespasses, ¹⁴ by canceling the record of debt that stood against us with its legal demands. This he set aside, nailing it to the cross. ¹⁵He disarmed the rulers and authorities and put them to open shame, by triumphing over them in him."

- The sacrifice at the cross cancels the record if debt owed. Jesus, the sacrificial lamb, was the payment for humanity's sin against God.
- Jesus nailed every sin at the cross, past present and future.
- This was a one-time payment that achieves forgives for those that receive the son.

John 3:36

³⁶ He who believes in the Son has everlasting life; and he who does not believe the Son shall not see life, but the wrath of God abides on him.

- Placing our faith into the finished work of Jesus will bring you into salvation. Depositing your faith into Jesus is like jumping out of an airplane with a parachute. The skydiver places their faith into the function of the parachute, or else they will die.
- Anyone not willing to receive the Son of God, Jesus, will have the wrath of God on them.



John 3:16

16 For God so loved the world (you and me) that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life.

The motive for the work of Jesus at the Cross at Calvary is His love. He gave His life for us because He loves us.
